This series consists of files of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) and US Air Force astronaut (1965-1986), Associate Administrator for Space Flight (1986-1989), and NASA Administrator (1989-1992) Richard H. Truly. Records contain materials, mostly from his tenure as NASA Administrator, reflecting policy studies and analysis; files on program development; correspondence, and memoranda between NASA officials, private sources, and other U.S. Government agencies; records of official meetings; and speeches given before various organizations. Specifically, this subject contains correspondence files; oral histories; meeting files; speeches; congressional briefings and budget files; reports to the Cabinet; Space Exploration Initiative (SEI); Space Station Freedom (SSF); Space Shuttle program; Truly's

flights as an astronaut on STS-2 and STS-8; Advisory Committee on the Future of the U.S. Space Program (Augustine Committee); and National Space Council (NSPC).
